Balati Campus

Construction has begun on our new campus that is located 1 miles from the original campus. Walls are rising on our first 4 buildings. When this new location is complete, we will be able to house an additional 320 children.

We will start the location with the capacity to house 96 girls. Plus, we will be able to bless the city with a community center.

Eventually, this campus will have fully furnished, separate accommodations for boys and girls, a gym, playground, generator, school bus, kitchen, computer lab, music room, and a bicycle track.
